An After School Program,* which is held at Indian Trail Junior High School for students in grades 6-8. Students have the opportunity to attend after school sessions with professional artists in music, theater and visual arts. The importance of this program is to provide students with workshops beyond their academic studies in the safe environment of the school. The ACA works with the administration and staff from the school to assure the program will be beneficial to the students wishing to participate. The

ACA believe arts education fosters critical thinking, problem solving, teamwork and appreciation of other cultures, as well as helps students develop skills that can be used throughout life. Mentors offer their expertise while working with students, many of whom would not otherwise have the exposure to certain disciplines due to the course of their academic studies.


The AAG offers workshops to the public, and it conducts

"Dots and Lines" by Bala Thiagarajan

"Dots and Lines" is an exhibit of Bala Thiagarajan's abstract paintings and mandalas. Mandala is a Sanskrit word that means circle. It symbolizes the universe and the cosmos. It is a visual representation used as a focus point for the practice of meditation.



Mandalas are ancient, sacred symbols of wholeness and are used for facilitating personal growth, healing, grounding and transformation. The intense repetition of pattern captures the attention of the viewer. All of Bala's paintings are created intuitively, painted freehand. "I add a mirror in the center of my mandala paintings, as they are about centering oneself and regaining a balance," explains the artist. "They also allow the audience to be a part of the artwork themselves." Bala's mandala paintings greet viewers with a sense of familiarity, with repetitive patterns reminding them of henna art, simultaneously creating an excitement to explore more of the texture and geometry. This vibrant and colorful exhibit will be at the ACA February 15 - March 17, with an artist reception on Saturday, February 18,
